GENEVA - A Yates County teenager was charged with two counts of criminal possession of a weapon last night after he and a passenger in the vehicle he was driving were arrested by city police for trespassing in a cemetery

Shortly before midnight, Hobart Security notified police that there was a vehicle in Glenwood Cemetery. Upon investigating the report, officers found William J. Schuler, 16, of 845 N. Flat St., Penn Yan, and Dennis Scott, 17, of RD 1 Scott Road, Bluff Point, in a car that appeared stuck in the snow in the cemetery

Police said that when they asked the pair what they were doing, they responded "chasing ghosts." Schuler, the driver of the vehicle, and Scott also told the officers that they had gotten the car stuck a few times in different places. Police said they investigated and found tire tracks where the car had been and possibly done damage.

Before the car was towed from the scene to be impounded, police said they took inventory of the vehicle and found a set of chuka sticks on the front seat, a billy club next to the driver's door and a set of metal knuckles between the seats in the front.

Police said Schuler told them the items belonged to him.


